Thomas Parham, Ph.D. is Vice Chancellor, Student Affairs, as well as an adjunct faculty member at the University of California, Irvine. Prior to these positions, he served as Assistant Vice Chancellor for Counseling and Health Services, Counseling Center Director, and Director of the Career and Life Planning Center at UCI. In addition to authoring six books, over thirty-five journal articles and/or book chapters, he has also produced several videos focusing on African American youth and counseling. In consultations, public addresses and television appearances throughout the United States, Dr. Parham has addressed such issues as multicultural counseling, counseling African Americans, and educating youth. Dr. Parham has received many honors and awards for his work; some of the more recent is the Janet E. Helms Award for Mentoring and Scholarship in 2010.
